There exist disputes between:

- (i) Mauritius and France concerning Tromelin and its surrounding waters (including its EEZ); and
- (ii) Mauritius and the UK concerning the Chagos Archipelago and its surrounding waters (including its EEZ): While Mauritius unequivocally asserts its sovereignty over Tromelin and the Chagos Archipelago and their waters (including their EEZ):
 - The French authorities unilaterally purport to exercise jurisdiction (which is not recognised by the Government of Mauritius) over Tromelin and its waters; and
- (ii) The UK Government unilaterally purports to exercise jurisdiction (which is not recognised by the Government of Mauritius) over the Chagos Archipelago and its waters.
- The issue of this licence does not relieve the vessel from the obligation to comply with any other enactment in force in Mauritius.
